As a government ordinance-designated city, it plans and drafts urban planning and environmental conservation.

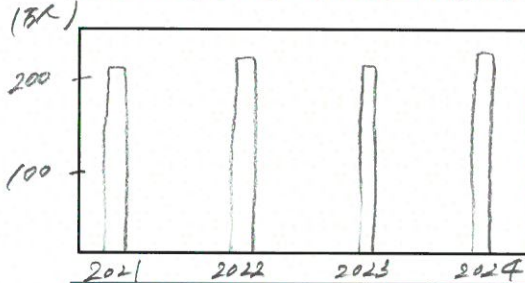
